CEWD and its members created Careers in Energy Week to increase public awareness about energy careers through a concerted nationwide effort. It's a great opportunity for energy companies to sponsor special events where schools, families, and other businesses can learn more about the energy industry and its importance to communities.

On Wednesday, Oct. 14, and Friday, Oct. 16, students from the Jobs for Michigan's Graduates program at Cody High School in Detroit will visit DTE Energy's Training and Development Center in Westland. During their day-long experience, student will experience:

- An underground splicing school and welding lab;
- The meter room where they will learn how to read and interpret the system;
- A nearby substation, which serves as a main power hub for utilities in communities throughout the state;
- The "Slip, Trip and Fall simulator," which focuses on safety practices for utility workers;
- A discussion on where to look for jobs and the educational requirements for those jobs.

On Tuesday, Oct. 13, and Thursday, Oct. 15, Jobs for Michigan's Graduates students from Lansing and Flint will visit the Consumers Energy Flint Service Center and Marshall Training Center. U.S. Rep Tim Wahlberg and other legislators will participate in the Oct. 15 Marshall event. During their tours, students will be introduced to the fundamentals of electricity and natural gas and learn about the many job opportunities available through hands-on and lab experiences including:

- Safety fundamentals and requirements, including an opportunity to wear fire-retardant suits/equipment and line-worker tool belts;
- Solar house tour;
- Using natural gas leak detection equipment;
- Gas line identification;
- Electric substation overview;
- Pole climbing demonstration.

The grant was awarded to the MEWDC to develop a talent pipeline management strategy for two key energy occupations in Michigan. Be part of the discussion on moving these occupations forward and hear what the MEWDC is planning for broader development of energy credentials, career pathways, and awareness throughout the state.

Featured speakers include: Stephanie Comai, Director of Michigan's Talent Investment Agency; Valerie Brader, Executive Director of the Michigan Office on Energy; and Ann Randazzo, Executive Director of the Center for Energy Workforce Development. The summit will also feature a panel discussion focused on Challenges and Opportunities in Michigan's Energy Industry and an Energy Showcase on the partnership between Oakland Schools, the Michigan Office of Career and Technical Education, and Consumers Energy.
